This report, prepared pursuant to section 20(5) of the Social Services Law (SSL), concerns: A report made to the New York Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse and Maltreatment (SCR) involving the death of a child.
The death of a child for whom child protective services has an open case.
The death of a child whose care and custody or custody and guardianship has been transferred to an authorized agency.
The death of a child for whom the local department of social services has an open preventive service case.

The Office of Children and Family Services (OCFS) is mandated by section 20 of the SSL to investigate or cause for the investigation of the cause and circumstances surrounding the death, review such investigation, and prepare and issue a fatality report in regard to the categories of deaths noted above involving a child, except where a local or regional fatality review team issues a report, as authorized by law.

Such report must include: the cause of death; the identification of child protective or other services provided or actions taken regard to such child and child's family; any extraordinary or pertinent information concerning the circumstances of the child's death; whether the child or the child's family received assistance, care or services from the social services district prior to the child's death; any action or further investigation undertaken by OCFS or the social services district since the child's death; and as appropriate, recommendations for local or state administrative or policy changes.

This report contains no information that would identify the deceased child, his or her siblings, the parent, parents, or other persons legally responsible for the child, and any members of the deceased child's household.

By statute, this report will be forwarded to the social services district, chief county executive officer, chairperson of the local legislative body of the county where the child died and the social services district that had legal custody of the child, if different. Notice of the issuance of this report will be sent to the Speaker of the Assembly and the Temporary President of the Senate of the State of New York.

This report may <u>only</u> be disclosed to the public by OCFS pursuant to section 20(5) of the SSL. It may be released by OCFS only after OCFS has determined that such disclosure is not contrary to the best interests of the deceased child's siblings or other children in the household.

OCFS' review included an examination of actions taken by individual caseworkers and supervisors within the social services district and agencies under contract with the social services district. The observations and recommendations contained in this report reflect OCFS' assessment and the performance of these agencies.

Presenting Information

An SCR report received on 12/21/28 alleged the mother, who was pregnant, became so impaired by marijuana, opiates, and benzodiazepines that labor was induced at 23 weeks gestation. The mother did not seek any medical attention when she realized she was in labor, but took another handful of opiates and benzodiazepines to address the pain. The mother gave birth to the subject child who was breathing but not crying. The mother then called 911, and the child was brought to the hospital where he was pronounced deceased on 12/20/18. The report further alleged the father and mother would have escalating verbal arguments in front of their three children, ages 5, 2, and 10 months old, and the mother had a long history of untreated mental health concerns.

Executive Summary

This fatality report concerns the death of a one-day-old subject child (SC) that occurred on 12/20/18. A report was made to the SCR on 12/21/18, with allegations of Inadequate Guardianship, Parent's Drug/Alcohol Misuse, and DOA/Fatality against the child's mother (SM) and father (SF). Niagara County Department of Social Services (NCDSS) received the report and began an investigation into the child's death. An autopsy was completed and the medical examiner noted the child was born at 22-23 weeks gestation and died of natural causes.

At the time of the child's death, his mother and father resided together with their 3 other children in common, ages 5, 2, and 10 months old. The mother had 3 additional daughters, ages 14, 13, and 11 years old; these children resided with their biological father. The father had three additional children, ages 17, 16, and 13 years old, who resided with their biological mother.

It was discovered on the evening of 12/19/18, the mother, who was approximately six months pregnant, was at her sister's home and began experiencing cramping and bleeding. The investigation revealed the mother took several of her sister's controlled substance medications and smoked marijuana in the hours leading up to the child's birth. The mother reported she did so due to the pain she was experiencing. In the early morning hours of 12/20/18, the mother gave birth to the child at her sister's home, and the child was breathing but did not cry. The sister and sister's boyfriend were present for the birth, and 911 was called. EMS responded to the address and transported the mother and child to the hospital. Although resuscitation efforts were made, medical staff declared the infant "non-viable", and the child was pronounced deceased at 6:30AM. Medical staff and the medical examiner could not say for certain that the mother's drug use caused the preterm labor and subsequent death of the child.

From the time the investigation began to the time of its closure, NCDSS met with the mother, father, and all surviving siblings and half-siblings on more than one occasion. Home environments were assessed and safety plans were implemented when needed. NCDSS filed a petition in Family Court and initiated court proceedings. NCDSS spoke with many collateral sources and offered the family appropriate referrals in response to the child's death. There were no criminal charges brought against either parent. At the time of the investigation's closure, the 3 youngest siblings were in the care and custody of a paternal uncle. The record did not reflect the mother's sister and her boyfriend were interviewed as collateral sources. Review of the case record revealed the Safety Assessments and Risk Assessment Profile to be inaccurate. NCDSS closed the investigation and opened the case for mandated CPS services, which remained ongoing at the time of this writing.

LDSS Response

On 12/21/18, NCDSS received an SCR report regarding the death of the subject child, which occurred on 12/20/18. NCDSS initiated their investigation into the reported fatality within 24 hours, coordinated their efforts with their Multidisciplinary Team, and promptly assessed the safety of the nine surviving siblings and half-siblings.

On 12/21/18, NCDSS spoke with medical staff who confirmed the mother admitted to using drugs and reported the father was abusive toward her. Medical staff later reported the mother and child tested positive for opiates, THC, and benzodiazepines at the time of the subject child's birth. The child was born at 23 weeks gestation. NCDSS also spoke to the father via phone, who reported the mother had taken her sisters medications in the hours leading up to the birth of their child. The father also stated that he smoked marijuana regularly. Due to the family's extensive CPS history, as well as concerns regarding drug use and interpersonal violence, NCDSS removed the 10-month-old, 2- and 5-year-old surviving siblings from the home. NCDSS reached out to the maternal grandfather, who agreed to have the siblings stay in his care while the fatality was investigated; he signed a relative placement agreement. During the investigation, the grandfather was granted temporary custody of the siblings via Family Court. The 6 half-siblings were not in the care of the mother or father, and therefore a plan was not needed.

On the same date, NCDSS met with the verbal sibling and half-siblings at their schools, and no concerns regarding their care when with their mother and/or father were noted. Only the eldest half-siblings had knowledge of the fatality, and reported the baby died due to being born too early.

It was revealed through interviews that the mother had gone to the hospital on 12/18/18 due to cramping and bleeding. Medical staff found the mother was not contracting, and therefore discharged her. The mother reported to NCDSS that she

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went from the hospital to her sister's home, and on 12/20/18, awoke in the middle of the night with more cramping and bleeding. The mother admitted she took "more than 5" of her sister's controlled substance medications due to the pain. The mother stated she delivered the baby at her sister's home and called 911 after the baby was born. She stated she and the child were then transported to the hospital. The mother also admitted to using marijuana daily.

NCDSS filed a Severe Abuse Petition against both parents in Family Court on 12/28/18. The judge ruled the siblings were to remain in the care of their grandfather and the mother and father were to have no unsupervised contact. Throughout the investigation, NCDSS gathered information surrounding the mother and father's drug use. It was discovered the mother engaged in using crack in August 2018. It was further discovered the mother had untreated clinical concerns that also affected her ability to care for her children. On 2/6/19, the mother and father appeared in Family Court and the mother entered an admission of abuse/neglect; however, the father did not. A return court date was scheduled for July 31, 2019, and the orders of supervision remained in place. The custody of the 3 youngest siblings was transferred to a paternal uncle.

Throughout the investigation, NCDSS completed home visits to assess the safety of the siblings and half-siblings. NCDSS spoke with many collateral sources, including law enforcement, the medical examiner, hospital staff, pediatricians, and school staff. The final autopsy noted the child's cause of death as "double outlet right ventricle" and the manner as natural. The allegations regarding the subject child were unsubstantiated, as medical professionals could not confirm the child's premature birth was due to the mother's illicit drug use. All other allegations in the report were substantiated. NCDSS closed the investigation and a services case remained open at the time of this writing.

Report Summary:

This report was received with concerns SM gave birth to the now 10-month-old SS six weeks premature, and SM tested positive for marijuana and opiates at the time of the birth. NCDSS appropriately tracked the case as FAR when it was received. The contract agency worked with the family under the supervision of NCDSS to address the concerns and family needs. A FLAG was completed, and all family members were seen and spoken with on more than one occasion. By the close of the case, NCDSS provided the parents with referrals for a dentist of the CHN and counseling services for SM and closed the case.

OCFS Review Results:

Although there was a need for services for the family and referrals were provided, by the close of the case, the parents had not followed through with engaging in any of the services, including substance abuse and mental health evaluations for the parents and counseling for the then 13yo. During the case, safety concerns arose that warranted a discussion about shifting the case to the investigative track, but this discussion did not take place. The contract agency provided incorrect and unsafe safe sleep education to SM.

8/18/09: IND allegations of IG, LM, and LS against SM and BF regarding 3 half-siblings.

3/6/08: IND allegations of IG against SM and BF regarding 3 half-siblings.

Known CPS History Outside of NYS

There was no known CPS history outside of New York State.

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Legal History Within Three Years Prior to the Fatality

Was there any legal activity within three years prior to the fatality investigation? There was no legal activity

Additional Local District Comments

NCDSS disagrees with the safety assessment issue comment. There were no changes regarding safety through the history of the investigation and the children remained removed from the parent's custody at the conclusion of the investigation. Even on non-fatality reports, it is common practice to use the same language on safety assessments if nothing has changed. NCDSS also disagrees with the RAP issue comment. NCDSS filed a severe abuse petition alleging abuse had caused the death of this infant. NCDSS was instructed by the CAC to ask the pediatrician if drugs were a contributing factor to the infant's death. NCDSS had already been told by the CAC it was unlikely any medical professional would say that. Of course, the pediatrician could not say if drugs were a contributing factor. NCDSS always wants to be consistent in what is alleged and determined. NCDSS filed a severe abuse petition alleging the mother's abuse caused this infant's death therefore abuse by the mother caused the death of this infant and it is reflected in the RAP and safety assessments.
